# All-Church Gathering on Sunday, May 17<sup>th</sup>

All members and friends of Pacific Beach UMC are invited to gather together to share in a lunch and a presentation of several items important to the life of this congregation. We will plan to be in Hughes Hall (sometimes known as the Social Hall) beginning at approximately 11:45 am (or whenever worship ends) to begin with a meal. A main dish and beverages will be provided, and anyone willing is invited to bring a side dish. (Please RSVP to the church office so we can make sure to have enough food.) After we've had some time to start our meal, we will begin discussing three important possibilities for PB UMC.

#### **Southern Cross Project**

The Southern Cross Project has been in early planning stages for some time now, and PB UMC's Board of Trustees has recently received detailed information on the scope and breadth of the project as well as an expected budget. This is a comprehensive project to address many needed facility repairs and upgrades as a cohesive whole, and it is now time for the people of PB UMC to explore whether or not we wish to move forward with the project and discuss ways to raise the necessary funds.

#### Readiness 360+

For the past seven months, faithful members of PB UMC have participated actively in the Cal-Pac Conference revitalization effort Readiness 360+ (R360). Group members have participated in meetings specific to PB UMC and also with several churches across the South District, and have explored areas of Discipleship and Missional Alignment. As part of this effort, R360 will present several "hands-on" opportunities to join even more fully in our life-changing ministries.

#### **Pastoral Intern**

Pacific Beach UMC has been approached by a student from Claremont School of Theology (CST) asking if we might consider taking on a Pastoral Intern as part of CST's Field Education requirement. While our Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) will determine whether any potential intern might be a good fit for our particular ministry environment, we as a congregation may explore whether or not we wish to benefit from additional leadership as well as take on the responsibilities inherent to an internship.

Please plan to participate in these important conversations as we continue to discern God's call on the people of PB UMC. Together, we are the body of Christ!

# Communion Offering: Imagine No Malaria

In sub-Saharan Africa, malaria continues to kill one person every 60 seconds. But there is hope! Imagine No Malaria is part of a global partnership, and together with our partners, our generation can beat malaria once and for all using a two-pronged approach: prevention and treatment.

Prevention includes distributing insecticide-treated bed nets to keep infected mosquitos from landing on sleeping people. Prevention also includes educating families on how to prevent getting malaria. Treatment of those already infected is two-pronged. First is building and supporting health facilities which help with diagnosis, individual case management, and access to medication. Treatment also encompasses training a network of community health workers who will take their knowledge back to their communities. Please join in the fight and dare to Imagine No Malaria ... anywhere!

# Pastor Bob's Printed Blog: Discipleship — Part II


#### Dear Friends:

In our continuing discussion of Discipleship, we have been exploring the meaning of discipleship specifically in the context of the community here at Pacific Beach UMC. After last month's post about discipleship, we have continued to have great conversations, and several members and friends of PB UMC have asked intriguing questions. It is my hope that we will continue in this dialogue, and that we can journey together toward a deeper sense of discipleship.

First and foremost, discipleship begins with Jesus. From the very beginning of his ministry, Jesus gathered people together to give a new and broader understanding of God's profound message for humanity. Those who gathered to hear lesus were called disciples, and it's worth remembering that it was not just "the twelve" who were named in this way. All who followed lesus were his disciples.

Today, we who gather in worship and fellowship and service continue to grow in faith and ministry. I believe that we are called to continually seek out a deeper sense of relationship with God, and that we can experience the fullest relationship when we commit ourselves completely. We are transformed, and we are invited to respond to God's grace-filled work in us. One way to think of this in a practical way is to commit with our head, heart, and hands, both in the ways we seek God and the ways we respond to God. In this way, we engage our intellect (our head), our emotion and our passion (our heart), and our action and service (our hands) to fully live out the transforming love of God through Jesus Christ.

This does not mean that all disciples live out these things in exactly the same way. Just as we are a diverse people, we are given a diversity of gifts and passions and abilities. Where some experience a drive to read theological books



and essays, others explore through conversation or debate. Where some are passionate about inclusivity ministries, others are drawn to creating quilts for babies or videos for websites. Paul writes in his first letter to the church in Corinth (I Corinthians 12) that we are given a variety of gifts even as we are empowered by the same Spirit. As we work toward giving of our whole selves in response to God's transforming work in our lives, we use our head, heart, and hands in a diversity of ways.

We recently hosted a Membership Orientation where persons considering membership at PB UMC - as well as current members who were interested in a refresher - examined the United Methodist membership covenant of prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. As a part of this, we distributed a new pamphlet briefly outlining this membership covenant alongside this practical commitment of head, heart, and hands. May we continue to experience God's transformation as we share ourselves - persons transformed by God's love through Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit with God's creation.



### PB UMC Voted Volunteer of the Year!

On April 8 of this year, one of our little-known ministries resulted in PB UMC being recognized by the County Board of Supervisors as the Registrar of Voters Volunteer of the Year. Unless you vote in our precinct, you may not be aware that every year, for the past 27 years and 38 elections, PB UMC has been THE place to go, to vote on election day. PB UMC started to open its doors to voters starting in 1988, sometimes to multiple precincts. Each year, members of our church undergo training in order to correctly setup and run a polling place for our neighbors, so that their votes can be heard on issues ranging from what local bonds we should support, to who our next President of the United States should be.



Many people have staffed our polling places throughout the years, both members of PB UMC and members of the public who volunteer in this public service. Harrell has served for over 20 years and just recently stepped down as our Precinct Inspector. Dick (15-year volunteer) has stepped up for the last two years to take over from Harrell. All has served for at least 10 years in the past. Tracy served for several years as well. At present, Tom, and Peter & Diana join with Dick to continue PB UMC's participation in staffing our polling place.

March giving was up, helping us to keep pace with our expenses. Expenses for the month look high because we recorded two months of apportionments (about \$3300 per month) in March, as the February check was dated March I. This month we are switching to an online version of our QuickBooks accounting system. The change should appear seamless and we are hoping it will make it easier to process payroll and track our financial state. Correction for last month: The February budget numbers for total available for ministry and expended in ministry should both have been \$32,533. The other budget numbers and all actual numbers were correct.
