Each week's service will invite us to "unwrap" something that leads us toward making our hearts, our lives, our families, our communities, and our world more like the home Christ's ultimate homecoming will make it to be. #1 Advent Kick-Off

Pacific Beach UMC will host our third annual Advent Kickoff on Sunday, December 3, 2017, beginning at 4:00 pm. We will have special Advent craft activities for participants to take home and enjoy. If you would prefer simply to connect with our faith community over a meal, join in at 5:00 pm. Bring your favorite potluck dish, or show off your best thanksgiving leftover creation (a side dish or a dessert), and we will provide some beverages. After dinner, we will have a program and gather outside around the tree in the courtyard to light it!

Pastor Bob's Printed Blog

Dear Friends . . .

hen I was a kid, we would spend summers traveling to be with family. It seemed to work as a rough rotation, alternating most summers between my dad's side of the family in Colorado and my mom's side of the family in Missouri. And no matter where we went, it was always home.

In Colorado, we would stay in my grandparent's mobile home with aunts, uncles, and cousins sprawled in various rooms and sofa beds. Going anywhere always included my grandfather's enormous yellow station wagon (nicknamed "Ol' Yeller"), and the home almost always smelled of my grandmother's cookies. Evenings were spent around the dining room table playing our own unique version of Canasta. It felt like home.

In Missouri, summers started at my grandmother's suburban home and inevitably transitioned to her cabin on a large lake. Days were spent fishing off the dock, or poor attempts at water skiing. Evenings included my grandmother's amazing southern-inspired cooking, and nights were spent with all the cousins sleeping on the screened-in porch. And when our visit covered the July 4th holiday, my crazy uncles would put together incredible fireworks displays that – in hindsight – should never have been legal. This, too, was home.

Neither of these locations were home in-and-ofthemselves. They were home because of the people who were there. We had history, we had traditions, we had ridiculous inside jokes, we had connection. We were united in love and compassion and familiarity. We were — are — family.

As I think about these times, I realize how lucky I am to have a number of micro-communities that I can think of in this same way. We have history and traditions and ridiculous inside jokes and connection. We are family.

This time of year is often considered a time to be with family and friends. Some of us will travel, and some of us will host family and friends who travel here. It is a time of homecoming, a time of connection, a time of celebration. While not everyone looks at the Christmas season as a time of joy – indeed for some it is a period of grief – we might all see this as a time of connection and hope.

During this month, we will focus on the idea of "Coming Home." Our worship services and sermons will focus in this way, and we will offer particular ways to connect with our faith family in fun ways:

December 3, 2017

Scripture: Isaiah 64:1-9

Activity: make an Advent or Christmas craft. (Bonus: the Advent Kick-off is this night!)



December 10, 2017

Scripture: Psalm 85:1-2, 8-13

Activity: wear your favorite (or ugliest) Christmas

sweater to church!

December 17, 2017

Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 Activity: sing Christmas carols.

December 24, 2017

Morning Scripture: Luke 1: 46-55

Activity: with family or a friend, talk through or even act out Mary & Joseph arriving at the Inn when they were turned away; then do it again, imagining that

they're allowed in!

Evening Scripture: Luke 2:1-20

December 31, 2017

Scripture: Luke 2:22-40

Activity: whether you celebrate the new year quietly or exuberantly, take time in prayer (alone or with others) to renew your covenant with God.

It is my hope, dear friends, that these Advent and Christmas celebrations renew the light of Christ for

us all.

ALICE Response to a Violent Intruder

ust as response to an airplane hijacking was updated after 9/11, so the response to an intruder is no longer just to lockdown in place. Dee B., Ken B., and Hope A. attended an ALICE Training Institute workshop sponsored by Philadelphia Insurance Companies. We learned the latest advice about responding to a violent intruder. We saw a vivid demonstration of the difference between huddling in a corner of the room, and actively moving to evacuate through all exits in a room.

The acronym ALICE helps us remember the actions one should take: not in sequential order, but as applies best in the moment to stay safe and reduce potential injuries. These tips are straight from the reference cards given out at training:

ALERT - Initial alert may be gunshot, PA announcement, etc. Avoid code words. [Use plain English. For example, say, "shooter in entry area." Not "code silver" as they sometimes have done in hospitals.]

LOCKDOWN - If *Evacuation* is not a safe option, barricade entry points. Prepare to *Evacuate* or *Counter* if needed.

INFORM - Communicate real time information on shooter location. Use clear and direct language, using any communication means possible. [Remember the nursery and Sunday school in Hughes Hall.]

COUNTER - As a last resort, distract shooter's ability to shoot accurately. Move toward exits while making noise, throwing objects [at shooter's *face*]. Adults may swarm shooter.

EVACUATE - when safe to do so , run from danger using non-traditional exits. Break windows at corners, if necessary. Rallying points should be predetermined [e.g., US Bank parking lot].

Expect an evacuation drill sometime soon at the conclusion of worship services. Though we hope never to confront a violent intruder, we can all benefit from knowing all exits to use in cases of fire or other emergency.

t this writing we are preparing a preliminary budget to be presented at the charge conference. Budgeting is a challenge, because we have more ministry work that we'd like to do than we have resources. Our initial budget is short by over \$20,000. We are committed to producing a balanced budget by January. The team is looking at pending grants to help fund Project Grace (aka Wednesday Night) and some promising ways to reduce expenses, but they are not yet concrete enough to put in the budget. I enjoyed getting to know Rebecca, and became fascinated with what she is doing at PB UMC. I wish her the best of luck, and look forward to seeing the results of her projects.
