n our prayerful journey through the season of Lent, we have been exploring ways that we might take time to reflect, take stock of our spiritual condition, and realign our lives. In doing so this year, we are approaching the Lenten season within the frame of rehab, understanding that there is much to explore and much to learn. We do this not only in remembrance of Jesus' forty days in the wilderness, but also to prepare ourselves for the celebration of Easter.

On Sunday, March 25, we will celebrate Palm Sunday, beginning our worship gathering in our courtyard and processing (walking together) into the Sanctuary together as we sing and wave palm branches. The message will focus on Jesus' traditional procession into Jerusalem before the Passover holiday. As always, our worship services will begin at 9:00 am and at 10:30 am.





Good Friday falls on March 30, when the church will be open from 5:00 pm to 7:30 pm for an exploration of the meaning of Good Friday for each of us as unique persons of faith. Suitable for persons of all ages and abilities, stations of interactive prayer and learning will be available for participants to explore at an individual pace.

On Easter Sunday, April 1, those who are willing to greet the beginning of the new day – experienced by some as a resurrection moment – will gather at Crown Point Park on Mission Bay for a sunrise service beginning at 6:00 am.



Back at 1561 Thomas Ave, Worship services will take place as usual in the sanctuary at 9:00 am and 10:30 am. The Easter Egg Hunt for children will begin in the courtyard at 10:00 am.

Easter is a celebration of hope and new life. All are welcome to join in thoughtful reflection, prayer, community, worship, and celebration.

Pastor Bob's Printed Blog



Dear friends...

Ithough this newsletter arrives in early March, I write this section just a day before the first Sunday in Lent. In our Christian tradition, this is a season that we take each year to reflect and to refocus our spirit on our Creator.

Among the ways that Christians sometimes refocus is through giving something up, such as red meat, soda, candy, or carbs. Others may take something on—prayer, devotional practice, small group study Last year, I listed several ways PB UMC members might participate in these kinds of practices, and this list may be helpful today. I would also invite you to make an intentional choice to participate in our Worship gatherings during this season as we explore Lent through the lens of Rehab, using a source from the UMC's Discipleship Ministries website. Rehab is a word that can refer to many different things, ranging from health (cognitive rehab, wildlife rehab, drug rehab, occupational rehab, physical rehab, psychiatric rehab, vision rehab, vocational rehab) to politics (restoration of disgraced politicians) to home improvement (*Rehab Addict!*). In general, the word *rehabilitate* means to restore to a condition of good health, ability to work, to restore to good condition or operation, or to restore a person's reputation.

This observance of Lent is a time to seek restoration for our lives. It is a time to reflect, take stock of our spiritual condition, and realign our lives. This is a practice that is important whether we are new to our faith or are lifelong Christians. To put it bluntly, we all have work to do.

Guided by Scripture as outlined in the Revised Common Lectionary, the full Lenten season will include the following themes (including those from last month):

- ₩ Wilderness 2/18
- **T** Intervention -2/25
- ♣ Program 3/4
- Promise -3/18

Of course, this will lead us to Palm Sunday where we will celebrate Worship with a traditional procession, including the waving of palms. More detail on this and all of our Holy Week events can be found on the front page of this newsletter. This leads us to Easter, and what a wonderful coincidence it is that we celebrate Easter on April Fools Day!

As it turns out, the entire Lenten season is bookended in holidays that remind us to love one another. While some see April Fools Day as a time of practical jokes, we may recognize that the vast majority of this joking is done in the spirit of joy and love.

And of course, we began the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday as it fell on Valentine's Day. One of the early saints for whom the day is named is remembered for performing weddings for people forbidden to marry, and for ministering to people who were outcast. Indeed, these are acts of love!

This Lenten season, I invite you to take the opportunity to reflect and realign. I invite you to dedicate yourself to a time of restoration to spiritual health. This time of preparation can help us to be more fully aligned with the image of God in which we have been created. Let us journey together.



We budget giving income evenly each month, though Easter and Christmas giving are notably higher. We've changed our "other sources of income" budget to reflect the timing of annual and quarterly draws from our legacy endowments. We hope this will smooth the budget variances somewhat and make it easier to interpret them.



Meet One Of Our Techies: Joe P.

recently had a fun conversation getting to know Joe P., our Sound and Technology Coordinator. Joe told me he has been coming to PB UMC for about 8 years. "I graduated from Monte Vista High School in 1993. I met Ron Jessee when he taught Drama and StageCraft there. I left the area shortly after graduating, but moved back in 2008. Ron and Louis were instrumental in helping me 'land' back in San Diego, and Ron quickly dragged me into the Christmas program. I started attending regularly after that, and very soon became the church's Sound and Technology Coordinator. I oversee sound engineering, live streaming, and lighting. Ron and I discussed what to call the group and we decided upon 'TechArts'." The TechArts team works in the booth at the back of the church.

Joe told me he really enjoys what he is doing. "For Sound Engineering we control the mix of instruments and vocals, making sure the right microphones are on at the right time (and, of course, off at the right time) and there is a proper balance between the instruments and the choir."

"Ron and I discussed the possibility of generating a live stream for members who cannot always attend church in person. We proposed the idea to Pastor Bob. He thought it was a great idea, and went along with getting it started. Live Stream now streams 2nd service every Sunday. Pat and Lea Ann W. generously donated most of the equipment to make it possible."

One other thing Joe has done recently is design the new tech booth. "Our former work area was on just a couple of tables behind the last pew. We would have to stand up and move our chairs whenever people needed to get by. Our new booth fills our growing needs. We have more room for our equipment and a better view of the sanctuary, with fewer interruptions. It makes it easier for us to fulfill the church needs."

Joe and his team do a lot for us. But, it turns out, his team needs some additional members. Please consider becoming a member of the team. Refer to page 3 for a description of these jobs.
