The Certified Lay Ministry (CLM) Orientation provides not only an overview of the process and intent of the program, but also an introductory overview of many aspects of local church ministry–from worship and theology to discipleship and

Wesley SD Internship Program

he Wesley SD Internship program is all about connecting areas of deepest passion with the life of the church. This 9-month program is an incubator for supporting innovative young people who are eighteen to twenty-five years old, and looking to do new and significant ministry in the greater San Diego community and the United Methodist Church. Interns develop an idea for ministry and Wesley SD helps them turn the idea into a reality. They are surrounded by a deep support network to make this happen. They journey in community with a cohort of other interns, are guided in leadership and spiritual development by an experienced Program Coordinator-Mentor, and are supported by a local church community and pastor. Pastor Bob's Printed Blog

Dear Friends . . .

n the middle of August, I attended the School of Congregational Development at the Town & Country Hotel in Mission Valley. The School of Congregational Development is a continuing education event for United Methodist leaders "for equipping conference leaders, clergy, and laity to lead vital, dynamic, life-changing congregations." Over five-hundred church leaders from around the country gathered to learn together about growing in effective ministry as United Methodists.

As I mentioned in the sermon the following Sunday, the theme of *Momentum* was one that resonated with me. This congregation at PB UMC, in particular, has much to consider when it comes to the momentum that has continued over the years, and we must take care in where we will ride this momentum going forward.

A helpful companion to momentum is *trajectory*. If momentum is a measurement of movement, we can think about trajectory as the direction of that movement. And we have momentum along more than one trajectory!

During the month of September, we'll take a few weeks and talk about some of this momentum and these trajectories, particularly talking about where we have come from. Our traditions and our history are important to understand, to know not only who we *have been* but also who we *are* and who we *may become*.

We will also take some time to refresh our Labor of Love project, a refurbishment of parts of our Sanctuary and Education buildings. All of this is connected, because we must understand that the energy and spirit and generosity and labor and love of those faithful members who



first gathered for worship here in the 1940s has been the beginning of both momentum and trajectory, and we have the opportunity and the privilege, and perhaps the responsibility, to build this momentum and fine tune this trajectory so that future generations of PB UMC participants may enjoy the life-giving ministry made possible in this community of faith.

Here's how some of our Labor of Love team put it:

"The building at Thomas and Ingraham has welcomed the beach community for decades. In recent decades, the congregation has expanded its definition of Community, and loved and welcomed those without a church to call their own. My hope is that this project will allow our church community to continue to extend that welcome and love to anyone who needs a community now, and provide a foundation for future generations to continue to practice extravagant love." – Joan F.

"PBUMC symbolizes a community of love and acceptance for all. Not only is the church a place of worship, but a place of shelter and physical/mental healing...a true sanctuary for those in need. Our physical presence in PB is represented by our Sanctuary and Education buildings, and they are a first impression to many who encounter our church. 

Meet Our "All Around Guy": Ken B.

recently got a chance to meet with Ken B., a very active "all around guy" in our church. Ken told me he lived in Philadelphia where he was a member of the Philadelphia Calvary United Methodist Church. In 2004 he moved to San Diego. He contacted the Reconciling Ministry Network, and based on what he learned, he transferred his membership to PB UMC. He definitely cares a great deal about our church and has become very active.

He is our Head Usher. He loves this job, as it facilitates him meeting all of us. He told me he is also one of three coordinators for the Interfaith Shelter Network. "We coordinate volunteers and help communicate with shelter guests."

"I recently attended the California Pacific Annual Conference, as the lay representative for PB UMC. I am active in our Growing in Faith and Staff Parish Relations (SPRC) committees. I am also a church trustee. It means a lot to me to be able to contribute to such a meaningful organization."

Does he work for someone besides us? "I work for the city of Escondido Water Department, mostly in water quality."

"I also have family members who live here. My sister came here to start all over, and that's what brought me here. Like her, I'd lost my job and my home before I moved here. I am still a work in progress. I've gotten a new job, but houses are very

expensive here. Still, I hope to get one. I don't know when I will retire, but I am optimistic about my future."

I asked Ken what he finds special about our church. "I love our ministry for the homeless. I got here with no job, and was almost homeless myself. I was living with relatives. That made me realize it is no fault of their own they become homeless when they lose their living. Our ministry is to help them get back on their feet. Case managers keep records, so we know some folks are definitely doing better and have some kind of place to live."

I asked him if he has anything else he'd like to share with us, and he told me he is the father of one 32 year old daughter, and grandfather to one 6 year old grandson. They both live on the east coast. He also told me, "I have been traveling to the Philippines to visit a friend. The next time I go, I hope to bring my friend back with me as a marriage partner. I am in the process of getting a K1B (fiancé visa) to make that possible."



We are very lucky to have such an active and enthusiastic member as Ken. I hope you enjoy getting to know him also.
