It was great to see some familiar faces as well as some new ones! I loved hearing your stories, learning about how you got to PB UMC, and discovering what is most important to you in terms of our ministry in this unique place. If we have not had a chance to connect, I hope you'll reach out and we can set something up. I'm happy to talk on the phone or schedule an individual Zoom session. I am delighting in getting to know the creative, caring, intelligent, passionate people of this congregation!

In addition to getting to know you a little better, I was also glad to have a chance for you to get to know me a little better as well. I thought I'd share a few of the questions that were asked of me during the Zooms, along with my answers.

How are you adjusting to your new role at PB UMC?

I'm loving it! While the pandemic makes everything a little more challenging, I feel like I'm getting familiar with the people and the processes of this church. The more acquainted I get with this community of folks and the ministries that happen in this place, the more grateful and inspired I feel. I will admit that I tend to want to "have a handle on" *everything*...and I want that to happen *right now*! So I've had to remind myself on more than one occasion to take a deep breath and have a little grace and patience with myself and the process. There is no other place that I'd rather be settling into, and I'm thankful for all of your kindness and support.

What kind of preacher do you consider yourself?

I generally think of myself as a lectionary preacher. I see preaching as an opportunity for praise, inspiration, education, spiritual formation, and pastoral care. My goal in preaching is to stay grounded in the scripture passage *and* explore a relevant connection to the realities of our daily lives.

Do you have a sense of vision for PB UMC? A sense of where you see us going?

I come with my "pillars" or "priorities" for ministry, and I very much want to know the "pillars and priorities" of everyone who is a part of this congregation.

Our vision will emerge from our shared sense of calling and desire to be instruments of grace, justice, and peace in the world. I believe that the way we'll move into the future will be shaped by who we are—our gifts and passions and graces—as well as by the ever-changing needs of the community and the world around us. So while I don't have a set vision for how we'll live into that, I am committed to discern with you how God is inviting us into the next steps and phases of our ministry.

Is there any hope of us gathering together as the church again?

There is EVERY hope. It will happen. While we are still living in this altered reality due to COVID, we are also looking toward the time when we can begin to offer some in-person gatherings on campus. We will continue to follow the recommendations of local government as well as the recommendations of our California-Pacific Annual Conference, and move forward as soon as we are able to do so safely and responsibly. There is a small group of people who are participating on a "re-opening committee." If you have a special interest in this area and would like to join us, please let me know. That committee will be meeting on Tuesday, September 1st at 6:30 pm, and we'll schedule an additional meeting for the month of September. You should have already received a survey designed to gather your thoughts, hopes, and concerns related to moving back toward in-person worship/ gatherings. If you haven't completed it, please do so if you're able. We want your input!

Be well, stay well, and know that you have a place of connection and belonging with your faith community. Let us pray for one another and reach out in all the ways we can to share love, grace, companionship with one another and all God's children.

Reflections From the Finance Team

The pandemic continues to affect both income and expenses this year. The net loss in the month of July is distorted by the timing of other income received (quarterly) versus budget (monthly), so the YTD number paints a better picture. We have not yet recognized as income the forgivable portion of our Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan, which is likely to cover our YTD losses. That is not to say that the PPP loan will be sufficient to cover all losses by year end. US Bank is waiting for Congress to finish changing the rules before publishing a loan forgiveness application.



Meet Beach Breeze Singer Diego L.

We now have a special choir, known as the Beach Breeze Singers, for the pandemic period. I recently got a chance to get to know Diego L., our talented Beach Breeze tenor. I asked him when he started singing. "In 2013, I started singing in Mexico City where I was studying at the National Conservatory of Music, the largest music school in Mexico. In 2017 I moved to San Diego to finish my studies at SDSU.

"Music has been part of my life since I was very young. My mother worked as chair of the cultural and artistic department for a large university in Guadalajara. Because of this, I got to see lots of different performances, and I fell in love with that world. My family has always been very musical. My grandmother was a pianist and a couple of my uncles are composers. It was that love of music that motivated me to become an opera singer."

He is dating one of our singers, Cambria M. "We have been together for over a year and a half now. She is a wonderful, caring, and loving person and a talented, hardworking musician. I am very privileged to be sharing life with her. We met in a production of Jonathan Dove's *Flight* at SDSU, which brought us together."

In addition to singing, he contributes to other parts of our church service. Music Ministries Director Ron Jessee has inspired him. Diego said, "Ron is a wonderful person to work with. He is a very passionate musician that loves what he does. He puts a lot of care in selecting music that not only showcases the strengths of his musicians, but can also connect and be meaningful to the congregation. Ron wants for the Beach Breeze Singers to be more involved in the church. This has been very special for me. Before joining the PB UMC music team I had been searching for a spiritual community that resonated with me. Singing, and reading prayers for the people of this community has meant a great deal to me; it makes me feel like I found something that was missing in my life."

I asked him if he had anything else he'd like to share with us. "I want to thank everyone for making me and the singers feel at home. It has been very special finding this place so diverse and welcoming, full of people committed to a community they love. It's a love that is contagious and I am glad I can be a small part in it."
