Advent Resources for Home

One of the many wonderful traditions of Advent is the Advent Wreath, which invites us to light a candle each week and reflect on the anticipated coming of Christ at Christmas. This year we have Advent "Table Tents" that are available for you to use at home. You may use them with an Advent Wreath, or choose to use them all on their own. Each week, a new Table Tent provides a brief scripture, an invitation for reflection during the week, and a prayer. The Advent Table Tents will be available for pick up at the Lighting of the Christmas Tree on the First Sunday of Advent, November 29th, at 6:00. Advent Study and Small Group: "Almost Christmas"

A Message From Pastor Lori

Dear Friends,

When I think back to the beginning of this year, recalling my hopes and expectations for 2020, I can say that nothing has turned out in quite the way I anticipated. COVID-19 descended early in the year and turned just about everything on its head. I can't think of anything that has remained "business as usual" in 2020. We enter into this Christmas season with hearts that perhaps long for "business as usual." The holidays are the time when we sometimes yearn to return to our traditions. We find comfort in doing things the way we've always done them. We find solace in the patterns that are so familiar. And yet, we know that Christmas, like everything else in our lives, will be a little different this year.

One of the traditions around Christmas that has been important for me has been to offer a Blue Christmas or "Longest Night" Service. This is a service that recognizes that, amid the regular festivities of Christmas, there are many who find the holidays difficult. At a time of year that is supposed to be "the happiest," there are some among us who struggle with sadness, grief, depression, even despair. How much more might that be true this year when all of us have experienced grief related to changes and losses around this pandemic?

The Blue Christmas/Longest Night Service is traditionally held on the Winter Solstice, the day of the year with the most hours of darkness. It is a quiet, reflective service that focuses our attention on the heart of the Christmas message: that light shines in the darkness, and the darkness cannot and will not overcome it. Emmanuel, God with us, comes into the places of shadow and loss and need to bring healing, hope, and transformation.

I have offered this service for many years at La Jolla UMC, and this year, I am excited to say, PB UMC and LJ UMC will join together for this special time. Pastor Bob and I are working out the details, but know that it will be held on Monday, December 21st in the evening. Please consider joining us to light a candle in the darkness and to remember, together, the Good News of God's outpouring love that comes to us in the Christ Child.

We had twenty-seven participants attend the annual Church Conference on Sunday, November 15th. We are grateful to our presiding elder, Rev. Paige Eaves, for guiding us through a time of business and a time of celebration/affirmation as we reflected on this past year and began to look toward the year ahead. Many thanks to TennieBee Hall for serving once again as our capable recording secretary. Here are a few of the highlights in case you missed it:

- ♦ Our lay leader, Ken B. shared a meaningful devotion based on the Beatitudes, highlighting some of our core values and commitments at PB UMC.
- ♦ Pastor Lori directed folks to the Disciple Making Report and Pastor's Report in the Church Conference booklet, offering a word of thanks for the warm and caring welcome she's received at PB UMC.
- ♦ An update was provided on efforts to review our membership records and fine tune our processes for keeping those records. We remembered two of our members, Frances Selleck and Al Hermann, beloved family who left our membership rolls in the last year to join the church triumphant. We give thanks for their lives and witness.
- ♦ We reviewed the Nominating Committee Report, recognizing that it's a work in progress. We look forward to welcoming Tom B. onto Church Council as he will be serving as our incoming Financial Secretary. We said a big thank you to Linda A., Kurt I.-K., and Vicki T. who are rotating off of Church Council at the end of 2020. Their service has been invaluable! We are still working to fill openings on Church Council in the focus areas of Staff Parish and Trustees. We are also filling positions on Nominating Committee. Please contact Pastor Lori if you would like to nominate yourself or someone you love for one of these important positions!
- ◆Terre F. gave an update from the Staff Parish focus group, thanking our staff for dedicated ministry during this challenging year.
- We approved the Pastoral Salary and Benefits Package/Housing Allowance.
- ♦ We voted unanimously to continue our support for candidate for ordained ministry, Adam M.-L. We lifted up and delighted in the many ways Adam offers love, ministry, and support in this community!
- ♦ Hope A. provided a financial update, and turned our attention toward a draft of the budget for 2021. The budget will be finalized in January.
- ♦ Ken B. provided a report on behalf of the Trustees focus group. PB UMC is now renting the Vickie Drive house to La Jolla UMC. The house on Reed Avenue is being repaired and renovated after the fire earlier this year. It is likely to be completed in early 2021. Upon completion, Pastor Lori will move into the Reed Avenue property, and it will become our active parsonage. Ken also shared that our Labor of Love Project has experienced delays due to the difficulty of getting permits during the pandemic. Once our permits are in place, the project is ready to move forward. We anticipate the completion of this project in 2021 and look forward to a big celebration!

We are at a standstill on the Reed Avenue Property. We are awaiting city inspections which have been delayed indefinitely. Based on the current status of the home, once it is cleared, we are looking at construction for a solid three months, potentially longer, to finish out the property.

All Thomas Avenue units are rented out at market rents.

The Vickie Drive property is in need of tenting for termites. We have yet to determine a time that will be best for the Rhodes family to vacate for a few days.

Finance

Church Council continues to refine the 2021 budget. The version presented to the November 15, 2020, all-church conference is a work in progress. We have moved Labor of Love construction funds from US Bank to Mission Federal and California Coast Credit Unions in order to ensure that all our deposits are fully insured. FDIC and NCUA have limits of \$250,000 per depositor per financial institution.

Our income and expenses continue to be well below budget in the pandemic. With help from the expected Payroll Protection Program loan forgiveness—not yet booked to the accounting system—we should end the year in pretty good shape. No federal assistance is expected for 2021, though, so next year may be a lot tougher.

Across the country, the people of The United Methodist Church are serving the people God loves. We're doing it at home, but so often we'd like to do more.

- We want to serve those in other places who are suffering.

Over 70½? Use Qualified Charitable Contributions to Save on Taxes. Generally, a qualified charitable distribution is an otherwise taxable distribution from an IRA (other than an ongoing SEP or SIMPLE IRA) owned by an individual who is age 70½ or over that is paid directly from the IRA to a qualified charity. Your qualified charitable distributions can satisfy all or part the amount of your required minimum distribution from your IRA.

Meet Financial Analyst Tom B.

I recently got a chance to talk to Tom B., who was elected to be the church's new Financial Secretary at the November 15, 2020, Church Conference. The Financial Secretary sends out quarterly reports, and keeps track of each individual donation in a special report that only he or she sees. A teller's report is sent out to church officials, and by contrast only shows the total amounts given to the many different accounts that the church has. Tom is ready to take over these tasks.

Tom and his family started attending PB UMC in 1994. He and his wife, Sally, have two children. Their son, who lives locally, is an air traffic controller, and their daughter is a 4th grade teacher in Northern California. They have three grand-children, with one granddaughter living in San Diego, and the other two living in Northern California. Tom and Sally travel to northern California to see the grandkids three or four times a year.

Tom has been retired since 2012, and has been assisting our Financial Secretary since 2013. First, he worked with Dick V S, and then with Linda A.

Prior to the pandemic, Tom, Dick, and Linda, along with Margaret S. and Toni W., met on Monday morning to count the cash receipts from the offering plates, review the checks, and perform online deposits. Then they balanced the accounts, and prepared checks and cash for deposit. They entered the information into the computer and sent the teller's report to the church treasurer, bookkeeper, pastor, youth minister, and secretary.

Since March, the routine has changed. No cash to worry about! Now, Dick enters the information into our accounting system; Linda comes in later and enters the information into Power Church, another accounting system. The results from the two systems are compared and differences are corrected. Linda then emails out the report, and Dick deposits the checks. Tom has been the backup for both Linda and Dick since March.

I really enjoyed getting to know Tom. I had no idea how complicated our financial activity is, and I am very happy that we have someone so dedicated taking care of it.
