

Meet PB UMC's Biggest Man: Mike H.

I recently got to know Mike H., who, at 6ft 9in, is our biggest man. In addition to getting his height, I learned a lot from him.

Upon moving to Pacific Beach about 2 years ago, Mike was walking around the neighborhood one Sunday morning. At first, he found that not one church had its doors open. Then, he says, "I was walking down Ingraham, and there, on the cement, was someone's writing stating, 'ALL ARE WELCOME.' I looked up to find that a set of doors to a church were wide open. That church was PB UMC."

"The setback COVID-19 hit that week, and everything was shut down. So, the next Sunday with PB UMC wasn't to happen for me anytime soon. Even so, shortly after that I was welcomed to be a regular weekday volunteer here at PB UMC." The pairing of Mike and PB UMC has been more than just a minor success.

At this same time, Mike became his own boss by starting up a concrete cleaning business. He gives the credit to PB UMC, for without them, he says, "it never would have happened." You might have also seen him at

the following retailers in Pacific Beach: The Valeros, and VP gas station. He now works at both locations. He is also a "self-employed concrete cleaner." "I am a bit of an overachiever and do tasks when they need extra help." Mike was recently told he needs knee replacement surgery, which will limit some of his activities.

He shared his pandemic time with me. "I haven't been to a church service since the COVID outbreak. I watch Southern Baptist services on TV (John Hagee), as I was raised a Southern Baptist. The services are very motivational. Even so, I will probably attend PB UMC services at the church when the pandemic ends."

He ended our conversation telling me, "I am hoping for things to get back to normal. Maybe I'll become part of our church again." We hope so, too, Mike!
