A Message From Pastor Lori

When I Am Among the Trees

When I am among the trees, especially the willows and the honey locust, equally the beech, the oaks and the pines, they give off such hints of gladness. I would almost say that they save me, and daily.

I am so distant from the hope of myself, in which I have goodness, and discernment, and never hurry through the world but walk slowly, and bow often.

Around me the trees stir in their leaves and call out, "Stay awhile." The light flows from their branches. And they call again, "It's simple," they say, "and you too have come into the world to do this, to go easy, to be filled with light, and to shine."

The pine tree in the middle of our courtyard is one of the first things I noticed about the PB UMC campus when I arrived here several years ago. While it was showing signs of age, it communicated a word of warmth and vitality with its gentle and lovely presence. It was some months later that I found myself sitting in front of it, really taking a good, hard look at it for the first time. I was, yet again, alone on campus as we were in the heart of the COVID lockdown. I was frustrated trying to videotape my sermon in the hot sanctuary, messing up, and starting again... and again...and again. I decided to step outside for some fresh air and sat down on one of the benches. As I looked at the tree, calmed simply by being in its presence, I was aware of the breeze as it made the tree dance and sway. I was mindful of the birds that flitted in and out of its branches, finding shelter and a place to sing or rest. In the words of Mary Oliver, our tree "saved me" that day.

Since that time, I have come to appreciate that tree more and more. It was around the tree that we had our first in person gathering during COVID. We spent about 20 minutes together, masked and outside, to light the tree for Christmas. We worshipped under and around that tree for months before we felt safe enough to move worship back inside. We have enjoyed Easter Egg Hunts, and Coffee Time, and all sorts of formal and informal fellowship under its watch and care.

As many have known and commented, our beloved tree has struggled. We have consulted an arborist,

treated the soil, done all we can to maintain and sustain it. We are at the point where our tree has come to the end of its natural life and it's been recommended that it come down. We are so grateful for its quiet, majestic presence among us. The tree will be removed the week following Easter. So this Easter it will preside over one last Easter Egg Hunt, and then we will gather for a short ritual of letting go and saying goodbye. Finance

We reported last month the plan to move \$200,000 that remained in the Frank Gooden Memorial Account after the completion of Labor of Love to a fund at the United Methodist Foundation. That transfer is complete, and we are grateful for the opportunity to maximize the benefit and longevity of that remarkable gift.

2023 will continue to be a year of stabilizing our financial situation, using our resources wisely and trusting in God who provides. Please join your Church Council members in finding creative ways to go an extra step in supporting the mission and ministries of PB UMC.

Need a few examples? We'll provide one each month! For example, Pastor Lori is donating her mandatory salary increase for 2023 back to the church on top of her regular giving.

Vision Forward Update

On Sunday, March 19th, 30 of us gathered to share our hopes and dreams related to how PB UMC wants to be in ministry in this current day and age. We were fed a delicious lunch provided by the extraordinary Dart and Amberlyn R.

We recognized changing trends in our culture related to how church and religion are viewed and we acknowledged the challenges that COVID-19 heaped on an already struggling church. We also named and celebrated how precious it is to be part of a faith community in which we can worship, study, play, laugh, cry and walk alongside one another through all of life's seasons.

Knowing we want to extend that life giving opportunity to others, we tossed around questions like, "What are our strengths? What do we want to be known for in our community? Who is around us? How do we connect with them? What are their real and particular needs?" We reviewed recent demographic information and looked for trends that might inform our next steps. And we talked about an opportunity to take some literal steps to help us get a sense of the invitations and opportunities around us.

Over the next months, we are hoping that many of us will participate in Prayer Walks around our community. A Prayer Walk (or drive) is a way of walking attentively through the neighborhoods around us, making note of what we see, and being in prayer for each household. We'll post a map of our surrounding area on the back of the white board at church and invite folks to highlight the areas where they've walked. In addition, we'd love for you to send us your Prayer Walk observations. We'll list those on the white board as well. We get to know the people around us and their needs not only through data but by placing ourselves in those places and spaces and asking for God's guidance as we move forward. Look for the map on Sunday morning as well as more detailed instructions about how to participate in the Prayer Walks!

Reflections From the Finance Team

It's still early in the year, but February brought increased giving—a trend we hope will continue as the year unfolds. Giving in all areas was above budget for February but below budget in January. In addition, our 2023 budget was adopted with a deficit in income of approximately \$43,000 so there is work to do. We had higher than anticipated expenses in February, some of those expected and part of routine operations. For example, we completed our annual maintenance of our fire extinguishers as well as the semi-annual test of our Fire Suppression System. We had unexpected expenses related to a roof leak in the sanctuary as well as the repair of the dryer used for Project Grace and Interfaith Shelter.

April Communion Offering Native America Ministries

The Native American Ministries offering serves to remind United Methodists of the gifts and contributions made by Native Americans to our society and in our communities. There are more than 20,000 Native Americans within the denomination. and the fund allows The UMC to partner with existing native ministries to develop new programs. It also provides scholarships for Native Americans attending United Methodist schools of theology. When you give generously, you equip seminary students who honor and celebrate Native American culture in their ministries.
