We will meet over the summer months to plan for our return to sit down meals in the fall. They are remarkable human beings, but they cannot do it alone! We need the help of many to make sure we have the people resources we need, hands and hearts, to make this transition successful and a good experience for all.

In the quiet, restful moments that I hope find you this summer, I pray you will ponder, percolate, and consider how you might get involved as we move Project Grace into this next step and new beginning. Reflections From the Finance Team

While we continue to closely monitor income and spending, April was an encouraging month for PB UMC. It was a big month in that it included five Sundays, one of which was Easter.

Pledged giving for the month of April was slightly below budget, and overall pledged giving for the year is also running slightly below. Thankfully, unpledged giving was higher than anticipated in April and is also above budget year to date.

On the other hand, income, including funding for Project Grace, is significantly below what we've budgeted for year to date. This is not out of the ordinary in that Project Grace is supported through our donations but also through grant money and holiday offerings which come in sporadically throughout the year.

Our spending has also been slightly below budget, leaving us close to on target for our overall budget year to date.


