Reflections on Annual Conference

This June marked the 39th annual session of the California-Pacific Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church. Normally a blurb for the newsletter would be some variant of a highlight reel. However, at least for me, this year's theme of rest and renewal resonated strongly. In particular, the opening worship spearheaded by the Cal-Pac Young Person's Council held remarkable significance for me.

As part of the opening prayer, the lead pastor of the Native American UMC in Anaheim led us in a prayer in 7 directions—the cardinal directions of east, south, west, and north, followed by down, up, and inward. When the pastor asked us to start in the direction of "east" many of us froze. At a moment's notice, do *any* of us know which direction is East? I whipped out the compass on my trusty iPhone which made a *somewhat* educated guess. But even the electronic gizmo in my hand was not accurate. The body generally agreed that the back wall was east-ish; and at least to check Google maps, it was the safest bet.

This made me realize how disconnected we are from our surroundings—our buildings and sidewalks disconnect us from nature, our grocery stores disconnect us from the food we ingest and the workers who harvest it, our technological devices disconnect us from one another, and the endless clamor of news cycles and hype disconnect us from the spirit within our very bodies.

Psalm 46:10 admonishes us to "Be still and know that I am God." In the Elijah story retold to us by Bishop Dottie Escobedo-Frank, Elijah experienced a windstorm, followed by an earthquake, followed by a raging fire. Yet God was not to be found in any of those events. God was found instead in the sheer silence.

It is my hope that as a faith community we would not only reconnect with everything around us, but that we would also make intentional space for rest and renewal, and in the process, may we encounter the living God.

Christmas in July!

It's never too early to think about Christmas! And one of our favorite Christmas traditions at PB UMC is preparing food/gift baskets for local families in need. For many years we have worked with Community Christian Services Agency (CCSA), to offer this meaningful support during the holidays. Pam and Mike have graciously led and coordinated this effort for years and are at a place and time where they need to pass the baton to others. We are looking for one or two or three folks to coordinate our 2023 effort. Responsibilities include communicating needs to the congregation, collecting money donated for non-perishable foods and gift cards, and organizing the baskets. CCSA provides great instructions and Pam and Mike are always willing to answer questions and share their wisdom. A Message From Pastor Lori

Beloveds in Christ,

Ken B., Adam M-L, and I recently attended the 39th annual session of the California Pacific Conference. The theme of this year's conference was "Nourish" and it took place at the Sheraton in L.A. It was the first Cal-Pac Annual Conference for our new bishop, Dottie Escobedo-Frank. She is a wise and kind leader, deeply attuned to the needs and hopes of clergy and laity and deeply intentional about our ministries of peace and justice in the world. There was much that happened during this Annual Conference (AC), and I'll share a few highlights:

The youth provided the opening worship service and began with a land recognition, naming the fact that we gathered on Tongva land. It was important and moving, and not at all a surprise that our young people led us in this necessary work.

Our AC continues to focus on the mission of "eliminating physical and spiritual hunger." As Ken reported in church, we are doing this by focusing time, money, and attention in the following areas: (1) Poverty, (2) Inequity, Discrimination and Oppression, (3) Conflict and War, (4) Climate Change and (5) Food Insecurity and Malnourishment. We spent the good part of an afternoon naming the ways that many of our congregations are participating in this focused ministry, and encouraging on-going work that tends to the physical and spiritual hunger of people and our world.

Adam shared on Sunday about the Racial Equity Audit that has been on-going in the last years in our AC. There was a "round table conversation" involving some of the leaders in this work, including the Rev. Dr. Christopher Carter, known to many in our congregation. We received preliminary results of the audit and heard reports in the following areas:

(1) The complexities and challenges of cross racial and cross-cultural appointments,

(2) Disparities in salaries, (3) Disparities in grant awards and (4) On-going trauma related to racism. As Adam reported, there is now much work to do. If you are interested in

learning more or doing more, please reach out to Adam, Ken, and/or Pastor Lori.

We nominated reserve delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference as many who were elected pre-pandemic are no longer able to serve.

The next General Conference meeting will be in April of 2024 in Charlotte, North Carolina.

There are approximately 20 congregations seeking to disaffiliate from the California Pacific AC. There were several motions and a protest by churches seeking disaffiliation, asking for the conference Board of Trustees to reconsider the requirements to disaffiliate, specifically the requirement to pay 50% of the value of the church property. That motion was defeated. There will be a special session of the Annual Conference in November of 2023 to approve the disaffiliation of congregations and to adopt the Annual Conference budget for 2024.

One of my favorite parts of the Annual Conference is worship. Even though I missed being in the chapel at Redlands, it was a joy to worship with siblings from across the conference. Much of the music and motion of worship reflected the multicultural diversity of our conference. We remembered those clergy who died in the past year, we celebrated retirements, we baptized the infant of a clergy family, and we rejoiced as a wonderful class of folks was commissioned and ordained. All offerings at this year's services went to the United Methodist Immigration Crisis Fund to support welcome centers, care packages, and ministries among migrants across our conference. We were reminded in word, music, and action of our calling and purpose to love one another as Christ loves us. I left the Annual Conference feeling a little weary in body but joyful in spirit. May we continue to build beloved community...for one, for all, in our corner of the world.



Reflections From the Finance Team

As you can see from this month's finance table, year-to-date we continue to outspend our income. The good news is that we are not doing this to the extent anticipated in the original budget. In May, giving exceeded what we anticipated, and expenses were slightly below what we anticipated. That's good news but year-to-date, we have overspent our budget by \$17,627. We had anticipated overspending by \$23,257 at this point in the year, so we're moving in the right direction. We are grateful for your ongoing and generous support of the mission and ministry of PB UMC. You make a difference!



It is that time of year again for us to think about collecting backpacks and school supplies for low-income families that will be distributed by Community Christian Services Agency (CCSA). We do not have an exact date yet, but their collection dates are always somewhere in mid-July. Watch for an upcoming list of the requested supplies. 
