# Volunteers needed for Interfaith Shelter Program at PB UMC 2024

Pacific Beach United Methodist church, as part of its ministry to the homeless community, has served as a host congregation for the Interfaith Shelter Network for over 30 years. The success of this ministry is due to the volunteers and supporters who have donated their time, talents, and services. In continuing this tradition of service to the community, PB UMC will be hosting the shelter program in 2024, from January 27<sup>th</sup> to February 10<sup>th</sup>. We need volunteers, and there are a variety of areas where your help is of greatest need.

- There are setup volunteer opportunities, where we transport shelter guest's belongings from the previous host church to ours, after getting beds (cots) and setting them up. We need setup volunteers early morning on Saturday January 27<sup>th</sup>.
- Prior to the arrival of our shelter guests, we need volunteers to contribute breakfast food items, and other items on our needs list. During their two-week stay here at the church, we provide guests with items they will need to prepare their breakfasts and bagged lunch sacks for the day. They'll return in the evening to enjoy a nice, prepared dinner.
- We need individuals or groups to serve as dinner hosts. The dinner host prepares meals and serves the guests around 6:15 pm on their assigned evening. The church's kitchen is available for use for all meal preparations. And we (IFSN coordinators) are willing to work around your schedules, so if you need to arrive at the church early to prepare your gourmet meal, no worries.
- After our guests finish their meal, they help clean the kitchen and then settle in for the evening. Each evening an overnight supervisor volunteer is there, another area of participation waiting for you. Overnight supervisors eat with our shelter guest during dinner and sleep overnight in a private room.
- On February 10<sup>th</sup>, the shelter program here ends for the shelter season; therefore, we need volunteers to help with breaking down beds, collecting used linens for laundry, and packing up our shelter supplies.
- The last and final area where we need volunteer help consists of washing the used bedding, linens, blankets, and returning them to the church clean, and folded for storage.

So where do you begin to volunteer? By looking at all open volunteer opportunities on the sign-up sheets located in the church narthex during worship services. If you have any questions just ask me, Ken, one of the coordinators.

We are grateful for your continued support and service to this vital ministry in the community.

May the light of God's love meet you anew this holy season.

## A Message From Pastor Lori

Beloveds in Christ,

A new year is upon us! Regardless of all else, there is something profoundly hopeful about a brand-new year. I look forward to the ways that this congregation will grow deeper and wider in 2024 as we share Christ's ministry in this place, in our community, and throughout the world. As your Church Council has planned for mission and ministry in the New Year, we have come to a challenging place in the preparation of our budget. We know that our small congregation gives generously and faithfully. We also know that expenses continue to rise—for just about everything. For quite a few years, we have entered into the budgeting process with hope and a prayer, inevitably ending the year with greater expenses than income. In a spirit of transparency, we share with you that we are again facing a budget deficit to the tune of about \$80,000 if we have a typical year's worth of expenses. Intent on faithfulness to mission and ministry and seeking to be good stewards of our resources, we want to widen the conversation and ask for your help.

On Sunday, January 14<sup>th</sup> following worship, the Church Council will host a Town Hall Meeting on Stewardship and Finances for members and friends of the congregation. This will be an opportunity to learn more about our budgeting challenges and provide input and ideas about generating revenue and reducing costs. What are our highest priorities?

What programs are essential? What can we let go? How might God be calling us to do a new thing?

We need the wisdom and input of <u>all</u> of us as we navigate these challenging financial times. As I said to the Church Council last month, I am concerned about the budget, *and* I am profoundly hopeful about the life and ministry of this congregation.

We are a vibrant, inclusive, compassionate, community. We are growing larger in numbers and deeper in spirit. We host and support programs that truly reflect Christ's call to care for those most vulnerable around us, including Project Grace and the UCSD Free Clinics. *Be not afraid!* We know that with God's grace and guidance, we will navigate this difficult financial patch and continue to share God's light and love in ways that bring Christ's healing, help, and hope to all God's beloved world.

# January Communion Offering Human Relations Day

Human Relations Day is one of six Sundays that United Methodists set aside to support and celebrate specific ministries. We join other UMC congregations in a special offering to support neighborhood ministries through *Community Developers*, *United Methodist Voluntary Services*, and *Youth Offender Rehabilitation* Programs.

The Community Developers Program is a network of racial-ethnic UM congregations and communities throughout the United States committed to being in mission with the communities in which they are located. Churches within the network are focusing on education, housing, and homelessness, immigration, and racial equity.

Youth Offender Rehabilitation Programs promote ministries that respond to nonviolent young offenders through advocacy and community engagement. The program supports services such as reconciliation with families, training, organizing support, and development of reentry initiatives after incarceration.

The United Methodist Voluntary Services is in relationship with community groups and organizations that work with "the least of these." It addresses unjust political, social, and economic systems that continue to drain the energy and resources of those in poverty.


