Pastor Lori's Monthly Message

Beloveds in Christ,

Easter Sunday was a joy! Thank you to all who were a part of the celebration in body and/or spirit! It was a gift once again to share some of our Holy Week/ Easter services with our siblings at La Jolla UMC. Throughout Lent and Holy Week, we welcomed many friends, family members, neighbors and strangers as we sang and prayed, laughed and cried, listened and spoke, leaning into "the messy middle" and into our God of abundant love and grace who meets us wherever and however we are. I'm so grateful to have celebrated this Easter in and with this big-hearted community and I'm looking forward to all that is ahead in Eastertide and beyond.

There are so many aspects of Lent and Holy Week that have stuck with me. One of them is the importance of the table. I shared briefly during Communion at the Easter Sunrise Service about author Diana Butler Bass' words regarding the power of the table in the days before Jesus' crucifixion and after his resurrection. She points out that the disciples, following Jesus' crucifixion, "gathered in a room," which was likely the same room where they gathered Thursday night for the "last supper." In other post resurrection accounts, Jesus gathered with his disciples at literal or figurative tables, including a campfire where they shared a meal. Butler Bass rightly says that Jesus never took the disciples back to the site of the brutal crucifixion. No, the places he met them were gathering places, places with tables, places where people could break bread with one another. The cross is a central symbol in our faith for certain but perhaps the table is just as essential.

So I've been thinking about tables and opportunities to gather. Knowing this church has fond memories of small groups that gathered around tables, we've hatched a plan to revisit that old tradition and combine it with something relatively new. For the last several years, Les and I have hosted "Hymn Sings" at the parsonage, often combined with a potluck or BBQ. This year we want to take that tradition on the road. Over the late spring and summer months, we hope to have three or four gatherings in different parts of the county. (We'll still do one summer potluck/hymn sing at the parsonage on Thursday, August 28th!) Hosts can choose day and time, along with what we'd like to share...potluck of snacks or lunch or dinner or dessert? It's up to you! We'll do some sharing and sing some songs. Folks will be invited to come to the gathering nearest them OR venture out into the community and come to one or more or all! We already have one volunteer to host in the North Park area of San Diego. So we just need a few more!

Please let me know if you're interested in hosting or if you'd like more information. We'll begin to publish gathering places and times in the next few months so folks can join in where they're able. Opportunities to gather and break bread are not only fun but they are exactly where and how Jesus invites us to meet him, to meet one another...heart to heart, spirit to spirit, breaking bread and finding holy grace for the living of these days.

PB UMC has a long history of supporting the mission and ministry of Guatemala Project. Their website at www.sdguatemalaproject.org/who-we-are describes their work in this way: "The Guatemala Project, affiliated with the United Methodist Church, is doing truly awesome work in the Highlands of Guatemala. Over the past 20 years, we have built medical and dental clinics, a tailor's trade school, houses for widows and homes for mud slide victims, wood efficiency stoves, schools for children as well as having taken medical teams to serve the needs of people who may never before been seen by a doctor. So very many lives are transformed, one by one, family by family in Guatemala. Our mission is to assist Mayans in securing a voice in their own future. We accomplish this in partnership with faith-based communities in Guatemala and the United States by building educational, medical, and recreational facilities and providing scholarships, education, and home improvements in Guatemala primarily through the sale of Mayan indigenous products. Our shared work and prayers help support healthy, educated and culturally stable Mayan communities."

We hope you can join us in worship on May 4th to hear all the updates from a Guatemala Project representative and then stay after church to support this life giving ministry by purchasing beautiful, handmade items at the Guatemala Project Market that will be set up in the social hall. May Communion Offering PB UMC Solar Power Project

Exciting news: PB UMC will be getting solar panels sometime this year! And at that point, we'll be "off the grid." This will be our church's "environmental ministry."

Earlier this year, the Leadership Council voted to engage Aloha Solar Power to install solar panels on the roof of our office building. Since then, the contract has been signed and Aloha submitted their installation plans to the City of San Diego for permit approval. The city has responded with comments on the project and Aloha has responded to those comments and resubmitted the updated proposal.

Because the church is considered a commercial property for municipal permitting purposes, our permit may take a bit longer to be granted than it would for a residential property. But once the permit is granted, it should take less than a week for the panel(s) installation. The hope is that the project will be completed before the end of summer.

Our May communion offering is going towards this environmental ministry.




