Pastor Lori's Monthly Message

Beloveds in Christ,

We are only a few weeks from the season of Lent, a season that invites us to reflect deeply and intentionally. We are invited to turn inward, reflecting on matters of heart, soul and spirit as we prepare ourselves for the gift of Easter. We are also invited to turn outward, reflecting on how Christ's life, death and resurrection are of consequence in and for the world around us. The word Lent comes from a Latin word which simply means "lengthening." In these days of growing light, we pray that the light of Christ might grow in us as we purposefully move toward Holy Week and Easter.

This Lent our theme will be "Tell Me Something Good...Grounding Ourselves in the Good News this Lent." We'll visit this theme each week in worship and engage it/allow it to engage us through our digital Lenten devotional book and/or through printed daily devotional cards that will be available for pick up at church toward the beginning of Lent. As Christians, we are called to live in this world with eyes and hearts and spirits wide open to who is around us and what is going on in our lives and the lives of others. That's not always an easy thing to do. Many of us are struggling in these days that feel uniquely fraught – full of deceit, indifference and violence that disregard life and love. These forces are in no way new in this world or country but they somehow feel energized and more up close and personal. We need – our communities need – to hear "something good." Lent is the season that prepares our hearts and lives to receive the good news of Easter. So let us "ground ourselves in good news" this Lent, trusting that God's good news isn't just for some...it's for all. We are ready. We are waiting. We are open to the Spirit's movement within and among us this Lent.

Newcomers are encouraged— we are happy to teach!




February Communion Offering

United Methodist Church's Black College Fund

February is Black History Month and as part of recognizing this, PB UMC will allocate its monthly communion offering to the United Methodist Church (UMC) Black College Fund (BCF).

One of the most significant ways the UMC helps make quality education accessible to all is through the BCF. The fund supports the 11 historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) related to the church – the largest number of black colleges and universities receiving funding from any church body in the United States. More than 95 percent of all proceeds of the fund flow directly to HBCU campuses, where they help to strengthen programs, provide vital infrastructure and keep tuition costs low.





Our February movies feature an angsty '80s teenager and a mystical English nanny (no, not that one).

The first movie we'll screen on February 8th — just in time for Valentine's Day — is "Pretty in Pink" (1986), starring Molly Ringwald, Andrew McCarthy, Jon Cryer and Annie Potts.
