Piano Duo to Perform Sunday, March 15th

On Sunday morning, March 15th, PB UMC will have a wonderful surprise experience in the worship service. World renown pianists, Stephanie Trick and Paolo Alderighi, will be our special musical guests. They will be performing throughout the service.

The piano duo has earned widespread success with their arrangements of classics from the stride piano, ragtime and boogie-woogie traditions, as well as from the Swing Era, and indeed, lush hymn-tune creations.

Blending impeccable technique with mature musicality, Stephanie and Paolo have performed in a variety of venues across the United States, Europe, Japan, Israel and Australia. They have been featured in the following venues. Gilmore Keyboard Festival, Jazz at Filoli, the Musical Instrument Museum in Phoenix, the Kobe Jazz Street Festival in Japan, the London Jazz Festival, the Edinburgh Jazz & Blues Festival, the Ascona Jazz Festival in Switzerland, the Silkeborg Riverboat Jazz Festival in Denmark, the Bohém Ragtime & Jazz Festival in Hungary, the Milan Conservatory, Teatro Dal Verme Milano, Jazzland in Vienna, and the Jazz Bistro in Toronto, winning the acclaim of critics and fans alike.

I first heard Stephanie and Paolo at St. Marks UMC and immediately fell in love with their virtuosity. The service on March 15th will follow the usual format, and will include several spots where the duo will favor us with piano selections. Arrive early for their prelude starting at 9:50 a.m. Invite your friends and family. This will truly be a fascinating worship experience!



Pastor Lori's Monthly Message

Beloveds in Christ,

Over the years I have adopted various practices with the hope of observing a holy and meaningful Lent. I've given up caffeine and chocolate. (I can say, without a doubt, that distancing myself from either or both of those things did not bring me any closer to God or others. In fact it may have had the opposite affect!) I've also tried during Lent to "take on" certain practices. I've attempted to read the Bible more regularly, to keep a gratitude journal and to pray in new or different ways. All of these things were meaningful but none seemed to lead to the spiritual experience for which I hoped and hungered. So for many years, I gave up adopting a Lenten practice altogether. But I missed it! Each year during Lent I find I come back to wrestle with the possibility of a Lenten practice. Because somewhere in my spirit, there's a longing to mark this time as different. I recognize within myself a desire to change something up in order to reorient my mind and heart to God and God's good news.

As many of you know, our Lenten worship theme this year is "Tell Me Something Good." This series challenges us with the question: "Can we be 'good news' people in a world too often burdened by bad news?" This series invites us to ground ourselves in Christ Jesus, rooting ourselves for the first time or once again, in the essential words, actions and values of Jesus. As I was preparing for this Lenten series, I came across Nadia Bolz Weber's Lenten Reflection entitled "40 Days of Good #@%\$ (a Lenten discipline for cranky people). (#@%\$ is a literal and figurative four letter word...just in case you want to google the article yourself!) In it she talks about giving up stuff that's not helping her:

"I'm going to give up thinking I'm someone who could ever successfully give up sweets for Lent. That's a good

start. Maybe I'll give up some resentments I've been cherishing a bit too much and just gently let the story I tell myself about that person go. Or I'll give up on the idea that I can exercise my body back into a previous version of herself. That might be good. At some point I should probably give up thinking that if we order Chinese take-out it will be good this time."

She goes on. But then she also says she's taking on "stuff" that helps her, calling it "40 Days of Good #@%\$ Project." So her goal is to take a photo of something beautiful each day or to write a sentence about a warm interaction. The notion behind all this is that some days it feels really hard to find the good stuff going on around us. But if we plan to take note of something good each day, we are much more likely to notice it, when and where it happens around us.

So Les and I are giving it a go...reporting something beautiful, something kind, something gracious that happens in these forty days of Lent. I invite you to join us and, if you like, feel free to share with me, with one another or on our PB UMC Facebook Page. I pray the Spirit meets us in life giving and restorative ways this Lent. That we might see the world truthfully, not shielding our hearts from the reality of hurt and harm. But that we might also see the good in the world around us, grounding ourselves in the goodness of God, and becoming more and more generous in sharing that with others.

March Movies: Anthropomorphic Animated Animals and Unruly Angels

Our March movies are an Oscar-winning animated feature from just 10 years ago and a live action classic from 60 years ago.

The first movie we'll screen (on March 8th) won the Academy Award for Best Animated Feature: "Zootopia" (2016). Bunny Judy Hopps fulfills her dream of becoming the first rabbit police officer in Zootopia and promptly finds herself investigating a series of animal disappearances. Her unlikely ally: a crafty, legally challenged fox.

On March 22nd, we'll screen 1966's "The Trouble With Angels," starring Rosalind Russell and Hayley Mills (in her first non-Disney film). Mills plays a troublemaking newcomer to an all-girls convent school who tangles with Russell, the school's Mother Superior.

Movies screen at 1:00 p.m. in Hughes Hall. Popcorn and other snacks are always available but bring anything you like to snack on (such as a late lunch)!
