Forgive us for our undue and unreasonable signaling that fails to build your Church, that focuses on optics and misses the mark. Help us to be like the Disciple Jesus Loved, to lean on God

and trust in God's grace. Help us to be like Peter, to adjust our path when we find ourselves wandering. Help us to be like Christ, to be quicker to serve and slower to stand idly by. Help us to be like Jesus, to follow his example of love and compassion. With faith and resolve we pray, Amen.
